## A Letter From The Rector

Dear Friends:

Christ Church continues to amaze me. With all the reasons we have to circle the wagons, feel sorry for ourselves, or hedge our bets until things look brighter, instead we raise over \$40,000 to build a school in Renk, Sudan, we take on 110 families representing approximately 450 individuals and deliver over 300 boxes to Cathedral Shelter in the Christmas Angels program, we deliver gifts to 46 men from Higgins House, 25 men from St. Andrews Court, 24 women from Grace House, 39 women and children from the Primo Center, 25 men from St. Leonard's and five families from St. Gregory's, we stuff 50 stockings for the homeless, we feed 250 people at the Good News Soup Kitchen, and countless other acts of compassion all essentially in the month of December. Our middle schoolers were involved as the seventh grade class cooked for the Good News Soup Kitchen and they adopted one of the Cathedral Shelter families. The eighth grade and Youth Group wrapped the gifts for Grace House. December can be so dark and depressing and yet all of you have made it an opportunity for providing others with glimmers of hope.

Let me offer you my congratulations and thanksgiving and the assurance of my prayers that this new year will be a time of blessing and hope for you, and for the world the Christ Child came to save.

## 2010 Stewardship Update - (as of 12/16/09)

We are so thankful for the response from each of you in support of OUR church, but we are not out of the woods. There are still outstanding pledges which are needed in order to move forward with all of our ministries in the coming year. If you have yet to make a pledge, please help by completing a pledge card today.

As of December 16, we had received 284 pledges totaling \$991,562. Of these pledges: 106 pledges were increased by \$86,680, 38 new pledges were made totaling \$76,845, 27 pledges were reduced by \$34,876 and 113 pledges were unchanged at \$412,684.

The net increase in pledge commitments now totals \$128,649. Again, if you are able to make a pledge in support of our ministries, please complete a pledge card and place it in the offering or send it in to the church office. There are pledge cards available at the back of the church.

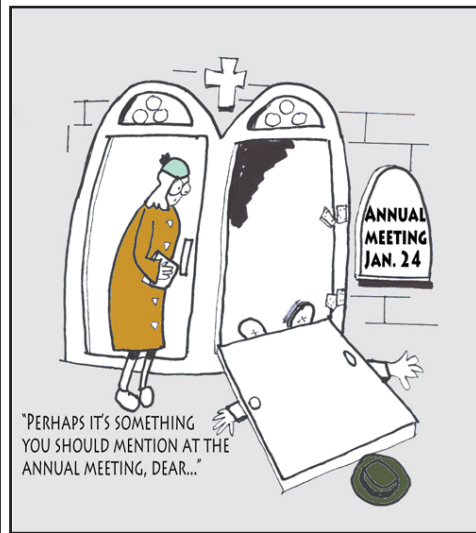

## Vestry Notes - December 2009

Dan George opened the meeting on December 1 with a meditation relating how Sunday services are contemplative and restorative giving us strength to love and serve the Lord.

The Rector reported on his many reasons for thanksgiving including the Diocesan Convention, Kerygma Bible Study, All Saints Day, "real bread" communions, baptisms, Evensong, his 65th birthday, the Bishop's Ball, Stewardship, the Nominating Committee, Jim Harrison, Thanksgiving Day, Advent, Josh Walters and Heath Missner. Jeanne reported that Lisa Lee, wife of Bishop Lee will be leading Sunday Forum in a couple of weeks and that Bishop Lee will speak to our downtown lunch group. Jeanne also reported on the Diocesan Convention.

Diocesan Report (Ned): The Bishop has sent Christ Church his/the Diocese's annual request for a pledge to the Diocese. Christ Church pledged \$160,000 in 2009 and we are being asked for \$229,000 in 2010 (this represents a percentage of specific revenue items). In 2009, we were asked to pledge \$215,000. We will need to finalize our budget before being able to make a pledge – and this process will not likely be complete until January/February 2010

Heath Missner Ordination application (Ned): Parishioner Heath Missner is coming to the end of a 4.5 year journey towards the Vocational Diaconate. Her ordination as Deacon will be on February 6, 2010 at St. James' Cathedral and Heath will serve Christ Church following her ordination. The Vestry voted unanimously to certify Heath as qualified to be a Deacon and Christ Church will advance her application as a result. All are invited to her ordination.

Stewardship (Steve Hudson, Gris Ware, Dan George, Jack Keller): We now have approximately 260 pledges totaling \$925,000. (For details please refer to the front page.) We have 55 outstanding pledges of parishioners who pledged last year but not this year with pledges totaling approximately \$100,000. It will be of utmost importance to our ministries that we follow up on these pledges.

Outreach (Robin Anstaett): Reported that Julie Flood and Donna Voges have led another successful year with Christmas Angels. (For a detailed listing of our December outreach efforts please refer to Ned's letter on the front of this issue of the Parish Paper.) Robin reported on the many in-kind Rummage donations in 2009.

Global Mission (Lisa Kerpan): Lisa reported on her new project "Buy a Brick, Build a School" that was one of the highlights of the Diocesan Convention. This program has as its goal the building of a school in Renk, Sudan. With a \$10,000 matching grant from the George and Amanda Hanley Foundation, Lisa organized an effort at the Convention to raise money from throughout the Diocese in \$10 increments to fund the cost of building a new school in Renk. This fundraising will continue throughout the Diocese and at Christ Church until sufficient funds are raised (minimum of \$40,000).

Pastoral Care (Buffy Ervin and Jeanne Stewart): The Pastoral Care Committee continues to meet the pastoral needs of the parish.

Formation (Kim Dougherty and Jeanne Stewart): The Alpha program will begin on January 12<sup>th</sup> and will run through March 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Member Development (Melanie Cody): The Mentor Committee has reached out to 17 new families. There was a Newcomers Party at the Rectory on 10/24. The Potluck dinner on 11/13 held at the Hambleton's home was successful with 35 in attendance. The annual Caroling party will be held on 12/13. The Lobster Boil is set for Feb. 6, 2010.

Other business: The Vestry voted unanimously to prepare the Pancake Supper for the Parish on February 16<sup>th</sup>. Ned reported that we have asked four individuals to serve on the Vestry to replace four outgoing members and all agreed to serve. Election of the new members will be at the Annual Meeting in January.

Treasurer's Report (Kathy Shanley): The year-to-date financials were presented to the Vestry and reflected the continued shortfall in pledge revenues. We still expect to be in a significant shortfall position for the full year which will be funded by tapping into our savings to balance our budget for the full year 2009.
