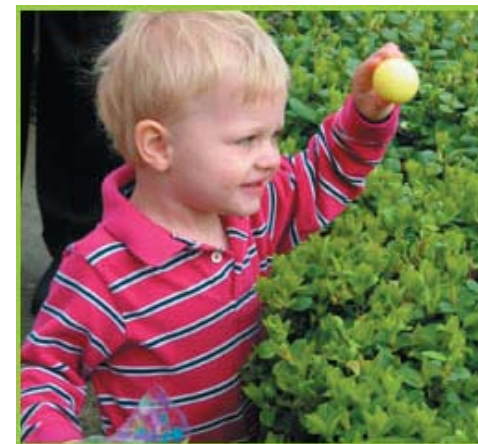

Holy Week

Maundy Thursday, April 5, 7:30 pm

The Maundy Thursday Eucharist commemorates Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. Maundy, from the Latin Mandatum or Commandment, refers to Jesus' commandment that his disciples love one another. Jesus shows them how to do this by washing their feet. Following the washing of feet and communion at this service, the altar is stripped and the sacrament is reserved on the Altar of Repose as we anticipate remembering Christ's death and burial (Child care is offered until 9 pm. The Watch concludes at 11 pm.)

Good Friday, April 6, 12 Noon - 3 pm

Clergy and laity of Christ Church, The Winnetka Congregational Church, the Winnetka Presbyterian Church, The Winnetka Covenant Church, Saints Faith Hope & Charity Roman Catholic Church and the Winnetka Bible Church participate in our ecumenical Service of the Cross. We are invited to all or any part of this service as schedules allow. Child care is offered until 3 pm.

Easter Vigil, April 7, 7:30 pm

The Great Vigil of Easter includes the lighting of the new fire and a candlelight procession from the Churchyard, Holy Baptism and the first Eucharist of Easter. A wonderful party follows in Church House, with each of us willing to bring food to share. (Child care is offered.)

Sunday of the Resurrection: Easter Day, April 8, 9 & 11 am

Identical celebrations include Choral Eucharist with a brass quartet. An egg hunt in the Church yard follows the 9 am service, weather permitting. Parking is available at Lloyd Park and Tower Beach parking lots, Sheridan Road. Child care is offered at both services.



Annual Parish Passover Seder

Please join us for a wonderful evening of fellowship and ceremony that begins by reliving slavery and ends by imagining what the world will be like when all people are free.

Our third graders will host our annual parish Seder on Wednesday, April 4 at 6:30 PM in the McClain room at Church House. Our guest

presider will be Marilyn Price who weaves a finely crafted performance filled with storytelling, puppetry and wisdom. Combining entertainment with some of life's most treasured values, this nationally-acclaimed storyteller, educator and puppeteer inspires her audiences to open their minds and their hearts. The seder is the highlight of the Passover celebration. The name Passover harks back to the time when God, through Moses, led the Israelites out of their slavery in Egypt. To recall that great deliverance, the elements of the traditional seder meal symbolize historically significant features of the Israelite experience.

Christians are particularly interested in this ritual meal because it was during the Passover that Jesus instituted Holy Communion. It should be realized, however, that the Passover clearly predates and is entirely separate from the Eucharist. The seder is a later Jewish form of the Passover observance, useful and important in its own right, having been practiced for more than 1,000 years. It must not be mixed with Christian concepts or expressions if it is to be authentic. It is a Jewish celebration of freedom useful in helping Christians understand Judaism and the roots of our Christian liturgy.

The seder is a dramatic yet playful dinner rich with stories, food and song. A full dinner is included in the celebration. Everyone is invited and we hope that all will attend. The nursery will be open for young children if they get restless and need to play.

Christ Church, Episcopal, Winnetka, Illinois, seeks a committed, experienced and enthusiastic religious educator to serve as its Director of Children's Ministries. Our new Director will support parents, teachers and students; organize, coordinate and administer our religious education programs and related special events; review, revise and enhance curricula; and promote vocational development. The ideal candidate will love God and children, possess an understanding of or willingness to learn about the Episcopal Church, work well with people, have experience as a primary school teacher or religious educator, and a working familiarity with Christian education. Prior training in the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* is desired, but such training can be provided if needed. The Rector serves as the Director of Children's Ministries' supervisor. The Christ Church staff enjoys a wonderful collegial relationship. Compensation will be competitive and commensurate with the successful candidate's educational background and professional experience, and he or she will work a flexible full-time, or substantial part-time, schedule.

Christ Church currently has 196 children enrolled in its religious education classes, which are taught by 32 volunteer teachers. Classes begin at the age of three and continue through Eighth Grade Confirmation.
