4) It can be as simple as buying lots of lettuce and delivering it to a fellow parishioner on the schedule to bring it to the Good News Soup Kitchen.

5) It can be as simple as purchasing apples and oranges and delivering it to a fellow parishioner on the schedule to bring it to the Good News Soup Kitchen. (Notice a pattern?)

6) You can sign up to just cook and there are EASY to follow recipes for the cooking-impaired. You then arrange to deliver the food to a fellow parishioner on the schedule to bring it to the Good News Soup Kitchen.

7) If you sign up for serving dinner you will find it to be a very fulfilling experience. Guaranteed.

8) You can engage your children in this ministry. Children age 6 and above are most welcome.

9) The schedule is very flexible. You may participate (serving, cooking or purchasing food) once a month or once a year.

Maundy Thursday - April 1, 7:30 pm

The Maundy Thursday Eucharist commemorates Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. Maundy, from the Latin Mandatum or Commandment, refers to Jesus' commandment that his disciples love one another. Jesus shows them how to do this by washing their feet. Following the washing of feet and HE at this service, the altar is stripped and the sacrament is reserved on the Altar of Repose as we anticipate remembering Christ's death and burial. (Child care is offered.)

Good Friday - April 2, 12 Noon - 3 pm

Clergy and laity of Christ Church, the Winnetka Congregational Church, the Winnetka Presbyterian Church, the Winnetka Covenant Church, Saints Faith, Hope & Charity Roman Catholic Church and Grace Presbyterian Church participate in our ecumenical Service of the Cross. We are invited to all or any part of this service, as schedules allow. (Child care is offered until 3 pm.)

Easter Vigil - April 3, 7:30 pm

The Great Vigil of Easter includes the lighting of the new fire and a candlelight procession from the Churchyard, Holy Baptism and the first Eucharist of Easter. A wonderful party follows in Church House, with each of us willing to bring food to share. (Child care is offered.)

Sunday of the Resurrection: Easter Day - April 4

Christ Church Parishioner, Ellen Whitesides, Helps New Orleans Public School Students Serve in Ghana!

In 2005 Ellen Whitesides and five fellow Teach for America colleagues started the Baobab Leadership Initiative. Just a few weeks after the organization's first successful service trip to Ghana, Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans and the project was put on hold for a number of years as the city started to rebuild. During this time, the world clearly saw New Orleans' leadership void as blame for lack of preparedness and poor governance passed between all levels of command. Currently Ellen works as board chair for the organization from Cambridge, MA where she is a student of Public Administration and International Development at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government.

As New Orleans continues to recover and rebuild, Baobab Leadership Initiative has emerged building leadership skills in public high school students through increased opportunities. Students participate in a year-long mentoring and leadership building curriculum focused on community service. The program culminates in a two week service trip to Ghana, West Africa. Jessica Lennix, former participant and current college graduate says "My trip to Ghana has impacted my life tremendously. I have a deeper appreciation for the little things that so many Americans take for granted." Volunteers Needed For the Good News Soup Kitchen!

If you are unfamiliar with this wonderful outreach program sponsored by Christ Church, here are some of the highlights:

The Soup Kitchen is not too far away (just off Howard Street in Rogers Park) but serves a very needy community of homeless and poor men, women and children. Approximately 160 people are served each night.

Our scheduling is totally flexible and based on your availability. Some families go down every month - some only twice a year. If you don't like to cook, you can help with the buying or serving.

The financial outlay is only about \$20-\$30 for your fruit or cooking ingredients. Recipes are really easy! Assembling the casserole will take about an hour of your time.

If you are serving, you can plan on starting between 4:30 and 5 pm and finishing about 6:30.

Currently, over 70 Christ Church families are participating - and when we say families, we mean families! Children age 6 and up pass out fruit, dessert, and milk or, if they are really lucky, run the dishwasher! Children under six often help at home with food preparation. Adults usually get the privilege of serving the hot portion of the meal.

The camaraderie among volunteers is great and makes the experience even more worthwhile!

Our Church has committed to providing the entire dinner on the second Tuesday and the fourth Saturday of the month.

Vestry Notes - February 23, 2010

The Vestry elected Mary Downie as Clerk, Kathy Shanley as Treasurer, and Doug Hambleton as Chancellor.

The Rector gave his report which noted how busy the start of 2010 had been at Christ Church. He reflected that the Youth Choir benefit was the evening before the Annual Meeting on January 24. The Annual Meeting gave us the opportunity to celebrate the ministries of departing members of the Vestry and also to give thanks for the ministries of all of our members. The Rector stated that the Annual Meeting also gave him a chance to outline three upcoming programs to the parish: the Talent Challenge, the program to read and study the whole Bible in a year, and Encountering Islam. The Rector also noted the Vestry Retreat had taken place on January 29 – 30. February was also busy, with the ordination of Heath Missner to the Vocational Diaconate at St. James Cathedral on February 6, a reception to celebrate Heath's ordination following the 9:30 service on February 7, the Lobster Boil on February 6, and the choir trip to the Cathedral of St. John the Divine and Church of the Heavenly Rest in NYC on President's Day weekend. The Vestry Pancake Supper preceded Ash Wednesday, and Lent inaugurated our Talent Challenge with the Forum dedicated to learning more about Episcopal Relief and Development's micro-finance loan program.

Associate Rector Jeanne Stewart described the 3-week Inquirer's Class beginning on March 7, for those wanting to be confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church or members seeking a refresher course on our faith.

Gris Ware (Stewardship) described the committee-in-information that will work to incorporate stewardship into parish life throughout the year. He described the committee's charge of setting goals for the short term, to cover the current budget shortfall, the mid term, to plan for the next two to three years on overall giving, and for the long term, to develop consistency. The committee will be led by the Vestry and include non-Vestry parishioners as members.

Kathy Shanley (Treasurer) provided an update on the financial results for Christ Church, noting that while revenue in January exceeded the budgeted amount, much of the excess consisted of prepaid pledges and contributions not pledged. Kathy noted that our budget anticipates a shortfall for the year, but that we were in pretty good shape for the first month of the year.

Robin Anstaett (Warden, Program) recommended that \$146,000 be directed from Rummage proceeds to the Benevolence Committee. She described the work of the Benevolence Fund, which provides impact funding to smaller charities, with priority given to Episcopal charities. She also reported that on May 16, the representatives of agencies who had received grants from the Benevolence Committee will worship with us so that the parish can see the impact of Rummage and the Benevolence Committee on the greater community. The Vestry voted to adopt the recommendation of Robin Anstaett.

Robin Anstaett and the Rector reported on the lease negotiations with Grace Presbyterian Church and the Samaritan Counseling Center. Robin Anstaett also reported on the successful Pancake Supper hosted by the Vestry, which generated a net profit of \$315 on expenditures of \$95. She noted her gratitude to Rick Jones for providing the delicious bacon and sausage. After discussion, the Vestry voted to earmark these funds for the Talent Challenge to benefit Episcopal Relief and Development's micro finance program.

The Vestry meeting ended with prayer and compline.
