Dear Friends:

I am very pleased to announce having called Jeanne Stewart to be an Assistant at Christ Church. Jeanne is a senior at Seabury-Western Theological Seminary and will be ordained to the Transitional Diaconate June 2 at St. James' Cathedral, Chicago. She will begin her duties here at Christ Church no later than September 1.

Jeanne was sponsored for the ministry by St. Augustine's, Wilmette, and lives in Wilmette with her husband and two teenage boys. As a lay member of St. Augustine's she has served as the co-chair of their Strategic and Discernment process, Senior and Junior Warden, lay Eucharistic minister, chair of the Social Committee and coordinator of the Usher-Greeter program.

Evensong Service

Our Youth and Adult Choirs will sing for an Evensong service at the Church on the Hill on the Eve of the Ascension, **Wednesday, May 16**.
