## Sunday Forum - May 3

To celebrate Christ Church's celebration of Earth Day the guest speaker at the May 3 Sunday Forum will be Rabbi Herbert Bronstein, Rabbi Emeritus and Senior Scholar of North Shore Congregation Israel in Glencoe. He will speak about "The Abrahamic Roots of Environmental Stewardship." Rabbi Bronstein is a gifted speaker and you won't want to miss this Forum.

### Special Rite Of Passage Celebration

During the 9:30 AM service on **Sunday, May 3** Christ Church will celebrate an important rite of passage with our 7<sup>th</sup> graders. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade class is named Rite-13. After the special liturgy we will celebrate with them on the 3rd. In some respects, this is a new way of saying to our young people things we have meant to convey all along- things like: "We stand with you as you make your way on the journey; we're here if you need us; we think you are terrific; we love you." We often assume that our teens feel appreciated and accepted as a vital part of our parish, but adolescence can be such a time of uncertainty that some things just can't be said often enough.

The Rite-13 Liturgy is a rite of passage that recognizes the gift that God bestows upon each one of us: the gift of manhood and womanhood. This is a free gift that we cannot earn and need not prove. This gift is the essence of who we are. The same energy that pushes us through adolescence gives us the power to change the world. As these young people grow and mature their knowledge and skills will increase, but the core of who they are remains the same.

Rite-13 is the liturgical cornerstone that lays the foundation for the entire congregation of Christ Church to rise up and in one mighty voice tell our young people, "You matter to us. Your lives are of inestimable value. The journey you are now embarking on is significant." It is a way that we fulfill our baptismal covenant of "seeking and serving Christ in all persons."

### Better Late Than Never

Even if you missed the April 28 workshop outlined below, it is still worth your time to attend the last two workshops in this interesting series. Christ Church young children participate in a religious formation program called the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. The Catechist (leader) seeks to help children come to know God by themselves. The program is based on the beliefs that: God and the child have a unique relationship with one another, and that children need their own place to foster the growth of the relationship, that growth should be assisted by the adult but is directed by the spirit of God within each child. All workshops are on Tuesdays from 9:30-11 AM.

## Rector Offers Perspective on Children And Communion

“To receive or not to receive, that is the question,” or at least that is a question families with younger children sometimes ask regarding Holy Communion. Those of us who grew up with the 1928 Prayer Book would probably remember that Holy Communion was restricted to those who had been confirmed. However, since 1979 when the Episcopal Church adopted a revised Prayer Book, all baptized persons are welcome to receive Communion. In the words of the Prayer Book, “Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ’s Body, the Church.” And so just as children are made members of the family of the Church through the sacrament of Baptism, so it is that they are fed as members of the family through the sacrament of the Eucharist.

In practice, there are a variety of ways children participate in receiving Communion. Parental discretion is always operative, with some parents desiring to wait until the child has a fuller appreciation of the meaning of Communion, while other parents prefer to have their children receive as soon as they express an interest.

Unlike the Roman Catholic Church which has a specific “First Holy Communion” ritual and age, at Christ Church we prefer to include the practice and meaning of Holy Communion in the curriculum of our church school classes. The Third Grade class has a particularly strong emphasis on the Eucharist.

My own experience after many, many years of administering Communion to young children, is that they have a childlike faith which is truly profound. Children are unencumbered by theological distinctions. They grasp mystery much more readily than adults. No one really “earns” the right to receive Communion because fundamentally it is a free gift from God to know the grace of life in communion with God’s son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

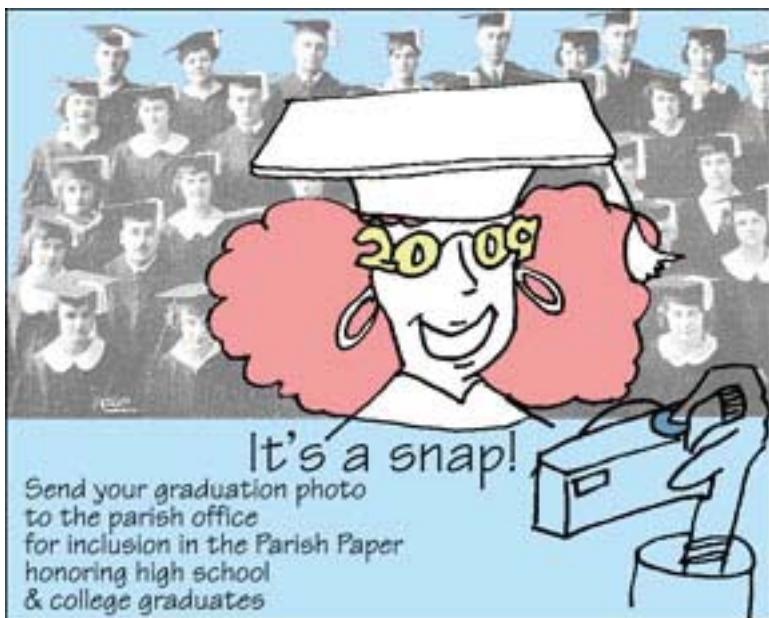

Every year, over 30 volunteers are needed to lead Church School classes at Christ Church. Classes begin at age three and continue through High School. The youngest children (three years old through second grade) meet in their classrooms for music and sacred stories during the Liturgy of the Word. Children join their parents in church at the Peace and stay for Communion. All grades meet in their individual classrooms for approximately 45 minutes following the 9:30 Eucharist, usually from 10:45 – 11:30. Church School classes will begin in September and conclude in May.

Never lead church school before? Not a problem. Experience is welcome, but certainly not necessary. You will be given everything you need to be prepared to lead, including class outlines and lesson plans. Classes are lead by teams of four or more volunteers.

Leading church school is a wonderful way to meet terrific people...to be involved in the Christian formation of our children and youth...and to learn and grow spiritually. You need not have young children to volunteer. We love Grandparents! Single people! Teens!
