A Letter From The Rector



Dear Friends:

Glory Story will be Christ Church's effort to read the whole Bible together from start to finish. We'll start next September and continue through May, 2011. The idea for this came from the Church of the Holy Spirit, Lake Forest, when that parish's church school leaders realized that there were chunks of the Bible that not only their students but also their teachers hadn't read. And so they issued this challenge: why don't we all read the Bible together? The whole parish. The whole Bible. The whole year. And so that's what they did and have been so enthusiastic about it that a number of other parishes in the Diocese including Christ Church have decided to join the parade.

We will be using a book called THE STORY, which has actually two versions—one for children, one for adults. It's a kind of Reader's Digest version of the Bible, breaking it down into traditional chapters. On Sundays, at Church School and in the Forum, adults and children will make their way through THE STORY, chapter by chapter. Teaching will be done at age-appropriate levels, and there will be an assignment each week for each of us to read on our own. This will require a commitment to keep on task week by week but one we believe will provide a wonderful spiritual blessing and focus for Christ Church.

At its March meeting, the Vestry considered this program and voted to endorse its implementation. Glory Story will be launched on Sunday, September 12, when we have planned an exciting presentation for the whole parish following the 9:30 service, and which will conclude with our Welcome Back picnic.

We believe the Bible is a wonderful, rich, sometimes mysterious story, but a story of comfort and of hope and is, amazingly to some perhaps, relevant to our lives! We believe that the prospect of the whole family reading the Bible together, the whole church listening for what God has to say to us, can only deepen our life together and help us be the people God intends us to be. We need you to be a part of it and will be providing more information as fall approaches.

Writing Scholarship Established for Alex McGuiggan

You never know what cards life is going to deal you. Parishioner Alex McGuiggan, son of Michael McGuiggan and Jill Fischer and brother of Lauren McGuiggan, died suddenly on February 22, 2009 at the age of 20. The Alex McGuiggan Scholarship has been established by those who loved Alex, to support promising young writers at the University of Colorado at Boulder where Alex was actively engaged in the writing program. David Rothman, a member of the English Department at UC, said, "Alex gave us all a great gift, and it is a powerful tool for teaching other emerging writers. Parish Benefits from a Great Harrison Package Deal

Christ Church has been blessed by the ministries of Missy and Jim Harrison these past (almost) three years. When Melly Turner was terminally ill in the late spring of 2007, Missy responded to our "Position Open" notice for a Director of Children's Ministries because she and Jim were moving to Evanston to begin his three years as a Seminarian at Seabury Western. Missy was an answer to prayer and jumped right in with her wealth of experience as Christian Education Director at their home and sponsoring parish of St. Jude's in Fenton, Michigan.

Jim has been serving as a Seminarian Associate at Christ Church since last winter, 2009. When Josh Walters left to become the Rector of Grace Church, Massapequa, last November, Jim has been quick to assume the work with acolytes, lectors, intercessors, and chalice bearers, with the Confirmation Class and Sr. High youth, and with welcoming newcomers. He was ordained a Deacon last December in Michigan, and we are looking forward to his Ordination as a Priest here at Christ Church on Saturday, June 12, at 10 am.

Last January the Vestry approved a budget that included provision for Jim's joining the clergy staff full time in the spring at Christ Church. I announced that provision at the Annual Meeting to the applause of those in attendance. We applied for and were subsequently approved for a grant from the Lily Foundation through the Diocesan Making Excellent Disciples program that will assist in Jim's compensation. He will begin officially as our Curate on May 1, but not full-time until July 1.

The Diocese of Chicago has commended Christ Church for the maintenance of a long tradition of raising up and training clergy whether as seminarians, curates, or assistants/associates. We are entirely pleased that Jim will be a part of that tradition and are doubly pleased that Missy will continue to be our Director of Children's ministries. God has blessed us and them and we are extremely grateful.

Visiting Author to Speak Monday, May 3

Can You Count To Four?

In January of 1993 soon after Organist and Choirmaster Richard Clemmitt came to Christ Church he restarted the Handbell Choir. The group currently is comprised of eleven women. It practices every Tuesday morning in the McClain room and performs about six times a year either before or during the 9:30 service. If you are fortunate enough to be present on a "Handbell Choir Sunday," you will see its members dressed in formal black and white, hands clad in white gloves (it keeps the oil off the brass) poised to play beautiful music. Each member has at least two and sometimes more bells in her charge depending on the complexity of the music. The church owns five octaves of handbells and five octaves of handchimes to choose from for any given piece. Many of the instruments have been gifts to honor past members. Most recently the largest bells were added as a memorial gift to Lucy Peterson, a former and faithful member who passed away in August.

On Tuesday, April 6, I was on hand to observe the 9:15 practice. What I witnessed was a tight-knit group of women who obviously enjoy each other's company and relish the sense of community offered by being a part of the Bell Choir. After a bit of catching up with chatter ranging from the welcome (or not so welcome) presence of rabbits in gardens to the advantage of staying in Winnetka during Spring Break so one can park in front of Starbucks, Richard officially began the practice with "The Lord be with you" followed by the Lord's prayer. Member Jane Whitesides said, "For an hour and fifteen minutes you can't think of anything other than the music. Not husbands or children or what's for dinner. You come away refreshed." Youngest member Peggy Coffee adds, "When you do think of those other things is when you make a mistake." Ann Ryan concurs, "I love this group. There is no homework. You get to see and experience Richard's wonderful talents, which are off the charts, and his patience."

Barbie Alt, who is the only remaining member of the original group, offers that "It has been a hard year for us as we lost three dear members of the group (Patti Willian, Rhoda Brown and Lucy Peterson) but it's all about family. This is the loveliest hour of my week and has been for seventeen years. It's pure joy. Richard is the most patient, kindest teacher. Job could take lessons from him."

Members of the group do not necessarily need to be able to read music to participate. Richard uses a system in which right-handed notes are circled in red and left-handed notes in blue. Liz Lind who has been a member for one year admits that "I don't read music. But I know my colors and I can count." And count they do. "One and two and three and four. One and two and three and four..."

Richard is always looking for new members. If you think you might like to add this "Zen experience" to your life, please contact him. In fact after covering the practice on the 6th I have decided to join. I am going to need to be careful what I decide to write articles about for the Parish Paper. If you can count to four, you too could become a member of this special group.

Churchyard Guidelines

The Christ Church Churchyard for the interment of ashes is one of our parish's true treasures. It is a beautiful place of serenity, peace and meditation that has been a part of our parish life since 1939. It is in the tradition of the hallowed churchyards of English country churches with the exception that ours is for the exclusive burial of ashes. Parishioners who wish to purchase plots in our churchyard may direct their inquiries to Molly Ethridge, Parish Administrator, 847-446-2850, ext. 23 or mollydsm@christchurchwinnetka.org.

The Churchyard was originally conceived as a "green garden." In more recent years parishioners have adorned the spots where their loved ones are buried with small, white flowering plants, both perennial and annual, as well as with flowers of other colors. In order to provide some guidelines in these matters the following suggestions are made:

It is preferred that natural materials be used and that their height not obscure plaques. The plots are quite small and we need to be sensitive to adjoining plots. Plastic materials are inappropriate. The Churchyard Committee is charged with maintaining the Churchyard but asks that parishioners be reminded that the watering of plants or flowers is the responsibility of family members or friends. There is a watering system in place for the grass and the euonymus, but it is not designed for any other plantings. Wreaths and other seasonal offerings should not remain beyond their green and fresh appearance. Finally, we ask that you not cut any euonymous vines surrounding your plot. If trimmed incorrectly, the entire vine will die. This task will be assumed by the Churchyard Committee. Maintaining the churchyard will continue to help all of us enjoy its beauty.

Vestry Notes - March 23, 2010

Heath Missner opened the meeting with a meditation on how a community that is creative and generous makes others lucky.

The Rector gave his report in which he noted that a new three-year lease had been signed with Grace Presbyterian Church and that a new lease was in progress with the Samaritan Counseling Center. The Rector noted that the parish was saddened by the death of Bob Wilcox, with over 350 people attending his funeral. The Rector stated that he was privileged to thank God for Bob's faithful and critical service to Christ Church, especially during the process leading up to the consolidations and renovations in 2000. The Rector reported that Bishop Scantlebury will make his Episcopal Visitation on Sunday, June 13, the day after Jim Harrison's ordination to the Priesthood. Bishop Scantlebury will be at both the 8 and 10 am services and will enjoy the parish picnic with us.

Associate Rector Jeanne Stewart reported that she and the Rector had shared responsibilities for the five-week Lenten program, which was going well. She noted that there was a member of the Pastoral Care Committee taking the training program to become a lay Episcopal minister. She briefly described the discussions taking place among staff and lay leaders regarding the possibility of reading the Bible in one year. She noted that the clergy, staff and lay leaders were busy preparing for Holy Week.

Gris Ware (Stewardship) stated that he had just received an updated list of parishioners who had pledged in 2009 but had not yet pledged for 2010. The Stewardship Committee will work through that list to determine if any additional pledges might be forthcoming for 2010. He noted that he had recently received a list from the Rector of members of the congregation who may be interested in serving on the Stewardship Committee, and that the Stewardship Committee's goal was to have an initial meeting before the next Vestry Meeting in order to establish goals for the spring and summer months. He noted that there was a gap between the 2010 budget and pledge commitments and that the Stewardship Committee would consider how best to try to close that gap.

Robin Anstaett (Warden, Program) presented the written report of the Member Development Committee that had been submitted by Melanie Cody. The report noted that two new families had joined Christ Church in 2010 and that all Newcomers would be personally invited to attend the Progressive Dinner on April 17. The report highlighted a number of Fellowship opportunities, including the Caroling Party on December 13, and the Lobster Boil on February 6. The report noted that additional volunteers would be greatly appreciated by the Hospitality Committee. The report noted several upcoming events, including the Great Party of Easter, following the Easter Vigil, the Progressive Dinner on April 17 and the SE Mexican Fiesta Fest on May 2.

Julie Flood (Outreach) reported that Rummage, under the outstanding leadership of Charlotte McGee, is in excellent shape for the two 2010 sales. She noted that Rummage had donated 104 hats to earthquake victims in Haiti and raised additional funds from the book sale on March 14. The Winnetka Women's Club will hold its annual Antiques Sale in 2011, after canceling the sale for 2010. She noted with gratitude that the Treasures room is being renovated by a Winnetka Eagle Scout, with new shelving, necessary repairs and re-painting. Christmas Angels is considering using surplus funds received in late December to provide "Back to School" kits for children in residence at Cressey House and the Primo Center, and noted that the use was consistent with assisting the population for whom it was originally intended and also consistent with our long-term vision of expanding the program to serve this population on a more year-round basis.

Julie also noted that participation in the Good News Soup Kitchen has seriously declined in recent years. She described plans to increase awareness of the program and dispel what appears to be common misconceptions about the time commitments involved, in order to increase the number of volunteers. Interested parishioners can contact Tika Walsh and Deb Emry, who chair this program. Similarly, the Meals at Home program is also deeply in need of volunteers. Interested parishioners can contact Elise Covey.

Lisa Kerpan (Global Mission) reported that the Lenten Talent Challenge was off to an excellent start, with updates for the parish available in bulletin inserts and on the web site. The ingathering celebration for the Lenten Talent Challenge will take place on April 18. She also reported that informational sessions had been held for the Mission Trip to SE Mexico, which will take place June 7 - 11. There will be a number of fund raisers to support the Mission Trip, including the sale of Easter lilies, a Fiesta Fest on May 2 and concessions sales at the Summer Rummage.

Formation (Kim Dougherty) gave an update on Church School and Confirmation Classes. Confirmation will take place on May 8 at 4 pm at Christ Church. She described in detail the proposal to read the Bible in one year, and the challenges of trying to integrate such a program into the existing Church School curriculum.

Heath Missner (Deacon, Pastoral Care) reported that pastoral visits were going well, and that a new parishioner was being trained to be a lay Episcopal minister. She stated that Teddy Bear Sunday had been very successful, with 173 teddy bears going to the Department of Children and Family Services.

KD Foster (Personnel) described the role of the Personnel Committee, to make recommendations on salary, bonuses, benefits, and policies

The Vestry meeting ended with prayer and compline.

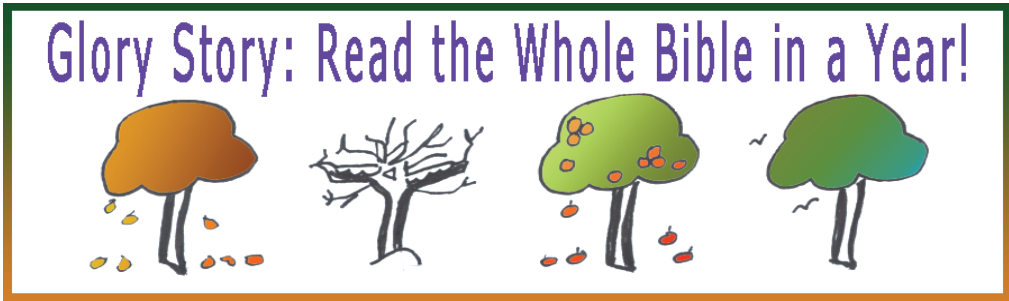
