A Letter From The Rector About Encountering Islam

After the Deanery Confirmation service on May 8 when it was announced that the Deanery was sponsoring a program called “**Encounter Islam**,” one of our Confirmands was overheard to say, “We’ve just affirmed our Christian identity. Why do we need to learn about Islam?” That Confirmand’s question reveals a deep resistance and suspicion in the Western world to Muslims, in particular, and Islam in general. Since 9/11 many of us have believed Jihad, in the form of terrorism, to be a central tenet of the Islamic faith. In fact it is not and in order to build bridges of peace and understanding we need to make the effort to go beyond media images and popular stereotypes.

To that end, the Deanery-sponsored “Encounter Islam” will be held on October 22 & 23, 2010, Friday 6:30–9 pm, and Saturday 9 am–4 pm, at St. David’s Church, Glenview. This day-and-a half program will survey the basis of Islam and the meaning of faith to Muslims, confront the sources of misunderstanding and anger between Muslims and the Western world and propose a pathway to cooperation in the workplace, schools, and civic life. The staff will include The Rev. William Sachs, Executive Director of The Center for Interfaith Reconciliation Enrichment, Virginia; and Imad-Ad-Dean Ahmad, Senior Lecturer at the University of Maryland and President of the Minaret of Freedom Institute, an Islamic think tank in the Washington, D.C. area. Expert presentations with open discussion will provide us with a great opportunity to learn more about Islam and explore ways to better live and work in our multi-faith world.

Registration forms will soon be available, and our invitation is open to people of all faiths and cultural backgrounds. Mark your calendars now and look forward to an especially fulfilling time together.

How To "Do" A Beach Service Or Summer Service 101

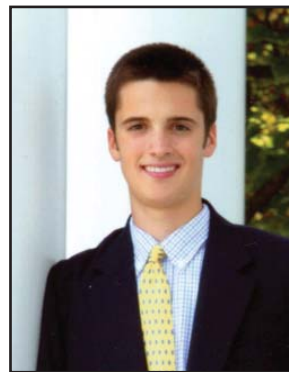


Lake Forest Academy graduate, **Andy Hambleton** will be attending Rollins College in Winter Park, Florida.

Teddy Challenger, a New Trier graduate, will attend Miami University in Ohio this fall.



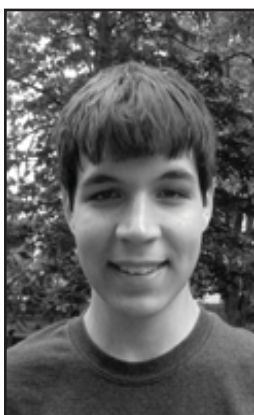
A newly minted New Trier graduate, **Andrew Peters**, will be attending the Rhode Island School of Design in the fall and major in Illustration.



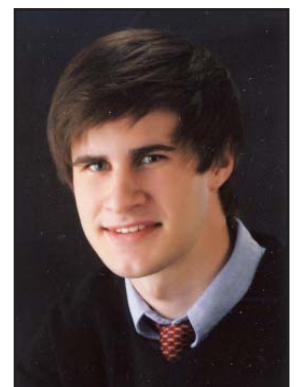
Parker Scully graduated from New Trier and will attend DePaul University in Chicago where he plans to study psychology.

Glory Story Logo Adopted



Here is our Glory Story logo/masthead created by our very own Ed Ethridge in anticipation of our September, 2010—May 2011 study of the Bible. Let's be reminded of the Rector's announcement in last month's Parish Paper:

"We will be using a book called *THE STORY*, which has actually two versions—one for children, one for adults. It's a kind of Reader's Digest version of the Bible, breaking it down into traditional chapters. On Sundays, at Church School and in the Forum, adults and children will make their way through *The Story*, chapter by chapter. Teaching will be done at age-appropriate levels, and there will be an assignment each week for each of us to read on our own (including chapters in the Bible that aren't covered in *The Story*.) This will require a commitment to keep on task week by week but one we believe will provide a wonderful spiritual blessing and focus for Christ Church."

Copies of *The Story* are currently available in the new cloister on Sundays (until June 13) and are always available in the church office during the week, along with inexpensive New Revised Standard Versions of the Bible and information about other study Bibles you may wish to have. Anyone and everyone is welcome to get a head start during the summer months. A wonderful presentation of the program will follow the 9:30 Eucharist on Sunday, September 12.

Vestry Notes - April 27, 2010

Lawson Whitesides opened the meeting with a meditation on the history of the Book of Common Prayer.

The Rector gave his report in which he noted that Holy Week and Easter services had been well attended, and the Talent Challenge had been a huge success. Jim Harrison's ordination will be on June 12 at 10 a.m. at Christ Church; Bishop Scantlebury will visit on June 13 at the 8 and 10 a.m. services. Jim Harrison will start as Curate on May 1, 2010.

Associate Rector Jeanne Stewart reported that the Downtown Lunch Group met with the Rector of Grace Episcopal. She and the staff were working on the calendar for implementing "Glory Story", the program to read the Bible in one year, and coordinating it with social and worship calendars. She noted that Deanery Confirmation will be May 8 at Christ Church, with half of the confirmands being parishioners of Christ Church.

Gris Ware (Stewardship) stated that the Stewardship Committee had begun reviewing the list of parishioners who had pledged in 2009 but had not yet pledged for 2010, and planned to call several parishioners on the list to determine if any additional pledges might be forthcoming for 2010. He noted that Doug Peterson had agreed to serve on the Stewardship Committee, and that a few others were considering serving. He noted that the gap between the 2010 budget and pledge commitments had closed somewhat, and that the Stewardship Committee would consider how best to try to fully close that gap.

Kurt Anstaett (Investments) presented the Annual Report of the Investment Committee, along with the 2010 Investment Policy Statement. The investments are making a good recovery from the 2008 market downturn. The Vestry approved the 2010 Investment Policy Statement and approved the reappointment of the members of the Investment Committee.

Pat Corrigan (Buildings) noted that Jim Caldwell continues to keep a tight reign on expenses, and that no capital repairs are currently in the works. Roof leaks at the Church on the Hill were greatly reduced this winter by the use of heat tape installation. Eagle Scouts continue to provide labor and materials for improvement projects.

David Russell (Senior Warden) presented the written report of Marcy Champagne on the Grounds Committee. The grounds are generally in good shape, with a number of small projects identified as a result of a tour of the grounds. Robin Anstaett noted the need to redevelop the Grounds Committee with Elise Covey's anticipated move.

Lawson Whitesides (Planned Giving) reported that he was in the early stages of forming a Planned Giving Committee, and will work with the Wardens and the Clerk to develop a program.

Kathy Shanley (Treasurer) gave an update on the financial statements through March 31, 2010. The year to date surplus is a result of prepaid pledges, and the current budget gap of approximately \$60,000 needs to be closed. Kurt Anstaett reminded the Vestry that a subcommittee needs to determine a plan to retire the mortgage on the West Building, which has a \$1 Million balloon payment due in 6 years.

Doug Hambleton (Chancellor) reported that the lease with Samaritan Counseling Center should be finalized within the next week to 10 days, and that the negotiations had been mutually supportive.

Lisa Kerpan (Global Mission) reported on the outcome of the Talent Challenge. A total of 42 envelopes containing \$100 each were taken. The array of talent shown by the congregation was amazing, and the results were incredibly successful. Following the in-gathering on April 18, the net proceeds to be forwarded to Episcopal Relief and Development is well in excess of \$8,000. The Communications Director of Episcopal Relief and Development has asked Christ Church to provide materials to make a tool kit for other parishes, and to be involved in publicizing the Talent Challenge throughout the Church.

The Vestry meeting ended with prayer and Compline.

Confirmation - This Year and Next

On May 8, Christ Church played host to the Evanston Deanery Confirmation. Bishops Lee and Scantlebury confirmed or received sixty people from seven parishes in the deanery. Thirty-two of those were from Christ Church. We had twenty-two youth confirmed and ten adults received. As is usual, Christ Church provided a beautiful reception following the service.

For the Confirmands and their leaders, this was the culmination of an extremely successful program year – one that began with significant changes. Those changes – moving meeting times to Sunday afternoons, meeting in small groups, attending Sunday Evensong, service projects, and retreat gatherings - will continue for the coming year. Once again, classes will be led by the Curate, Jim Harrison and Kim Dougherty (with the occasional guest) and will use the *My Faith My Life: A Teen's Guide to the Episcopal Church* curriculum. Students and their parents will be able to choose among three different seven week sessions – Fall, Winter, or Spring. Enrollment in each session will be capped at eight students and will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

Glory Story Church School Leaders Needed

This is an exciting year to be a church school leader at Christ Church. This is the year of the Glory Story: Read the whole Bible This Year. The entire congregation is invited to join in this opportunity. We will all be reading *The Story*. Our curriculum will not drastically change. Things will be moved around a bit to keep everyone in line with *The Story* reading each week. The exciting part is that the entire congregation will be reading the same Bible stories together every week for the entire year.

Never lead church school before? Not a problem. Experience is welcome, but certainly not necessary. You will be given everything you need to be prepared to lead, including class outlines and lesson plans. Leading church school is a wonderful way to meet terrific people...to be involved in the Christian formation of our children and youth...and to learn and grow spiritually. You need not have young children to volunteer. We love Grandparents! Single people! Teens!

The youngest children (three years old through second grade) meet in their classrooms for music and prayer during the Liturgy of the Word. Children join their parents in church at the Peace and stay for Communion. All grades meet in their individual classrooms for approximately 45 minutes following the 9:30 Eucharist, usually from 10:45 - 11:30. Church School classes begin in September and conclude in May.

Volunteers Needed For the Good News Soup Kitchen!

If you are unfamiliar with this wonderful outreach program sponsored by Christ Church, here are some of the highlights:

The Soup Kitchen is not too far away (just off Howard Street in Rogers Park) but serves a very needy community of homeless and poor men, women and children. Approximately 160 people are served each night.

Our scheduling is totally flexible and based on your availability. Some families go down every month - some only twice a year. If you don't like to cook, you can help with the buying or serving.

The financial outlay is only about \$20-\$30 for your fruit or cooking ingredients. Recipes are really easy! Assembling the casserole will take about an hour of your time.

If you are serving, you can plan on starting between 4:30 and 5 pm and finishing about 6:30.

Currently, over 70 Christ Church families are participating - and when we say families, we mean families! Children age 6 and up pass out fruit, dessert, and milk or, if they are really lucky, run the dishwasher! Children under six often help at home with food preparation. Adults usually get the privilege of serving the hot portion of the meal.

The camaraderie among volunteers is great and makes the experience even more worthwhile!

Our Church has committed to providing the entire dinner on the second Tuesday and the fourth Saturday of the month.
