ALPHA is a 10-week practical study of our Christian faith. We will explore such questions as: Why did Jesus Die? What does the Holy Spirit do? How does God guide us? Does God heal today? Why and how do I pray?

Our time together will begin at 6:30 pm including dinner, presentation and table discussion, and will conclude by 8:30 pm. In addition to the above dates, on Saturday, November 14 we will meet from 9 am-3 pm for a mid-course retreat focusing on the Holy Spirit.

Nearly 40 people have participated in our first offerings this past fall and this spring. Here are some of the responses from the most recent participants:

Participating in Alpha allowed me to delve into topics and wrestle with questions that moved me along on my faith journey. It provided an opportunity for me to get to know others at church that I didn't know before and to deepen my relationship with those I did. I highly recommend Alpha.

I loved the Alpha program. So many of my questions were answered, about Christianity in general and being an Episcopalian, in particular. I didn't have Sunday school as a child, so there were a lot of gaps in my knowledge, which Alpha helped fill in. Actually I hope to take it again someday; there was so much to absorb and learn, I'm sure I would benefit from repeating the course. I also enjoyed getting to know the other people in my class, all special and wonderful with lots to contribute. I looked forward to my Wednesday mornings so much and the time just flew. For me, the Alpha course was a little island of calm in a sea of worldly worries.

To consider the basic questions of faith in the company of a small group of Christ Church parishioners was a pleasure. The mixture of ages, experiences, and differing interests that each person brought to the gathering gave us unexpected insights into the issues that we studied.

If You Feed Them, They Will Come

If you have ever wondered about the origin of the term “multi-tasker,” you need look no further than our own Darlene McKinney. When there is a need to be met, the word “no” may not exist in her vocabulary. She fills twenty roles at once and looks like she still has time to spare. And she does it all with a smile.

Darlene is currently a member of the Rummage Steering Committee where she heads up the Hospitality effort and masterminds the Supply Department. She is also the head of the church’s Hospitality committee which is in charge of most of the receptions and coffee hours held on Sunday mornings, the Lenten dinners, the Alpha meals and various receptions for visiting clergy throughout the year. If you have recently eaten at Christ Church, it’s a good bet that it was organized by Darlene McKinney. (She gives credit to the Youth and Adult Choirs and Global Mission Committee who run their own events.)

Born Darlene Ann Giacomo in New Rochelle, NY, she and her two younger brothers grew up in Larchmont, NY where her mother still lives in their childhood home. After being “shy and retiring” in grade school, Darlene viewed the challenge of moving into a new high school as an opportunity to flip a switch and become an extrovert. At her all-girls Catholic high school she “held every elected and non-elected job in the school.” Upon her enrollment the school actually had a policy that no student could hold two elected positions at one time. Darlene challenged (and ultimately changed) that policy when her classmates elected her to two jobs. Her mom argued, “If my daughter is capable of fulfilling both jobs, why not let her?” Fulfill them she did. Splendidly. The multi-tasking dye was set at an early age.

She went on to earn a BA in English from Good Council College in White Plains, NY (no longer in existence) and a Montessori Teaching Certificate from Fairleigh Dickenson College in NJ. In the ensuing three years she taught at several different schools in CT and NJ. By the amazingly young age of 23 she owned her own Montessori school which she ran for the next eight years. This became a family affair as she hired her accountant father to do the books and briefly employed one of her brothers as an assistant teacher. While she owned and operated The Spring School she also taught in a Montessori teacher training program AND worked at night on her Masters in Early Education at the Bank Street College in NYC. In 1973 she met her future husband, Breece, at her uncle’s wedding. There is some debate about who picked up whom, but the outcome is the same. They were married four years later. Who had the good idea first no longer matters as they have celebrated their 31st wedding anniversary.

Breece’s work with Goldman Sachs constantly kept them on the move and provided many interesting travel opportunities which Darlene never turned down. They have lived in Greenwich Village (where they renovated an historic building themselves. Darlene admits that “Stripping 22 layers of paint with a heat gun is only a task for the young”.) They have lived in London on three separate occasions (where Darlene took classes at a Cordon Bleu Cooking School.) During one London stint in 1990 they flew to California to adopt their daughter Annsley. They popped their beautiful new daughter back on a plane to London and Annsley has pretty much been on a plane ever since. They instilled the love of travel, sense of adventure and curiosity about the world at large in their daughter at a very young age. “Annsley loves museums and she loves to cook. We trained her well. She likes what we like.” They relocated from NYC to Chicago when Breece took a job with First Chicago Bank and they eventually moved to the suburbs and landed on Woodley Road in Winnetka in 1991.

Once settled in Winnetka Breece, who was raised as an Episcopalian, did the prerequisite church shopping and found the people at Christ Church to be the friendliest and most welcoming (thank goodness we were “on”) and they had a new, dynamic Primary Choir Director. At the age of 6 Annsley was in Elizabeth Clemmitt’s first crop of choristers and Annsley continued singing in the Youth Choir until she graduated from high school as a Head Chorister in 2008. The McKinney’s have participated in five of the six choir trips to England. (Annsley wasn’t old enough for the first one or it would be six for six.)

Darlene has a passion for food, hence her involvement in everything “hospitality” at Christ Church. She enjoys cooking it, eating it and sharing it. She is passionate about the history and the culture and the people she encounters on her many travels. Her favorite trip was to Bali and at the top of her current “must see” list are India, Egypt and the Galapagos Islands. When she isn’t on the go she enjoys gardening, paddle tennis in the winter, tennis in the summer and the company of her beloved canine best friend, Lacy, year-round. Darlene’s can-do attitude and ability to find the best in everyone she encounters are infectious. She points out that all good parties start and end in the kitchen. Her goal is to expand the membership of the Hospitality Committee. She believes that “Hospitality is not just a food job. It’s a people job. We provide the fellowship. It’s what keeps you in the community.”
