We Walk Because They Walk  
CROP Walk Sunday, October 19<sup>th</sup>

Hawa gets water in Geles, a village in the Darfur region of Sudan where the Action by Churches Together-Caritas coalition has provided wells and other services. While the CWS-supported coalition effort focuses primarily on the needs of people internally displaced by the widespread violence in Darfur, it is also assisting nearby villages, many of which are hosting uprooted families. In the arid northwest of Kenya, 350 Turkana families in two villages are gaining clean water and sanitation facilities, with the help of the CWS Water for Life/Water for All program and a local partner. The people are providing the labor and some of the materials. The new wells will free up the women and girls from walking long distances to get water. Latrines and bathing cabins will help to prevent illness.

As a CROP Hunger Walker or sponsor, you help us reach out to children and families in Darfur, Kenya, and elsewhere with the gift of clean, fresh water and other empowering tools of hope.

- \$25** – provides blankets to a family of 5 displaced by natural disaster
- \$45** – provides 30 jerry cans to carry clean water for drinking and cooking
- \$150** – can buy a hundred chickens and two wire chicken coops, providing two families with a reliable source of eggs, protein, and income
- \$500** – provides small start-up loans that enable women to jump-start a business, such as making school uniforms

### A Quiet, Effective Ministry Reaches Far and Wide

In 1918 Carrie Healy's great grand-mother, Caroline Fenger, built a beautiful shingle house on Spruce Street in Winnetka. Ninety years later Carrie, her husband Duncan and their two children, Charlie 20 and Caroline 17 are the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> generation of Carrie's family to occupy that same beautiful shingle house. These are some serious roots.

Carrie was actually born in Washington DC then lived a bit in St. Louis and Denver before settling down in Lincoln Park in 1961 when her father began his medical practice. She is sandwiched between two brothers who "are still telling me what to do." She was a "lifer" at the Latin School (attended K-12) then went on to get a BA in Economics from Smith College and an MBA from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. Her son, Charlie, is following in his mom's footsteps by attending Wisconsin. Her parting words of advice to Charlie as he headed towards his freshman year were "I know how much fun you can have in Madison. Stay focused!"

After completing her MBA she headed back to Chicago (no surprise there) and began her career at Market Facts, did a stint in retail at Lands End Outlet and finally ended up as the Marketing Research Manager at Recycled Paper Products. Be sure to ask Carrie how that forward thinking company broadened her horizons in more ways than one. While Carrie was immersed in her single life in Chicago she met her future husband at an engagement party at her parents' house. In fact it was an engagement party for Duncan's former girlfriend. How is that for an odd way to have your paths cross? Their first date was on Carrie's birthday. They were married two and a half years later and then moved into a townhouse in the city. Carrie's beloved grandmother died in 1990 which left that beautiful house on Spruce Street in need of a Nadler to call it home. With Charlie and baby Caroline in tow, Carrie and Duncan moved north to Winnetka and settled in. When her children were toddlers Carrie obtained her real estate license with a plan to work "part time" for Jean Wright. That was fifteen years ago and she has happily been working full time ever since.

Carrie has always been active in the community. Some of her past volunteer activities include: serving as secretary and then president of the Field Museum's Outreach Council, being a member and one time president of the Auxiliary board of the Art Institute and serving for six years on the Winnetka Public Schools Foundation. She is currently on the Women's Board of Northwestern Memorial Hospital and is a member of the Winnetka Garden Club. Carrie allows as to how her participation in the latter group is because of a passion, not a talent. "I clearly grew up on the 16<sup>th</sup> floor overlooking Lincoln Park."

Carrie and her family have been members of Christ Church (thanks to Duncan's parents, Patti and Laurin) since 1992. They have enjoyed many choir trips to England as both children are very loyal followers of Richard Clemmitt. In fact Carrie recently joined the choir so that she too could experience the beauty of singing in the amazing cathedrals of England. Carrie was bitten by the travel bug early in life. After earning her own air fare by power-babysitting and agreeing to help her father with his scientific research she travelled to many exotic places like Arctic Canada, Alaska, Iran and the Soviet Union, among others.

Carrie has been a major presence on the Pastoral Care committee at church for the past eight years where she coordinates the meals to parishioners in need of a bit of TLC resulting from a death in the family or an illness or are in need of some extra help after the birth of a baby. This active effort is our version of the barn-raising, quilt-making, covered-dish ministry of a by-gone era. Carrie has brought it into this century by going on-line. She coordinates somewhere between 60 to 138 meals a year via email. Carrie says "It actually has nothing to do with the food. It's about the fellowship, the stewardship, the hug, the tears, and the joy. The food is the bonus. I love doing this and I hope to be doing it for a very long time."

When Carrie isn't selling real estate or coordinating meals on line she love to play tennis, read, hunt (yes, you read that correctly) and most especially spend time with her family (with Charlie at Cubs games and with Caroline at the movies.) When asked who would be next in line to call 602 Spruce Street home, Carrie noted that it would probably be one of her yet-to-be-thought-of grand children. You see three of Carrie's four grandparents lived past the age of ninety and Carrie plans to follow in those footsteps. "Besides, only the good die young."
